- Ghana sits on the Atlantic Ocean and borders Togo, Cote d'Ivoire, and Burkina Faso.
- Formerly a British colony known as the Gold Coast, was led to independence by Dr. Kwame Nkrumah on the 6th of March, 1957.
- Ghana became the first nation in sub-Saharan Africa to achieve independence from colonial rule.
- The country is named after the ancient empire of Ghana, from which the ancestors of the inhabitants of the present country are thought to have migrated.
- In the past two decades, it has taken major strides towards democracy under a multi-party system, with its independent judiciary winning public trust. Ghana consistently ranks in the top three African countries for freedom of speech and press.



Geography and Climate of Ghana

Ghana is home to Lake Volta, the largest man-made lake globally, which was built to generate electricity for the country.

The terrain of Ghana is made up of low plateaus and plains that are bordered by rainforests in the west and Lake Volta in the east.

It is 672 kilometers long from North to South and 536 kilometers long from East to West.
It was made up of rolling hills and flat land. The flat, dry Southern coastal region. It has hills covered in forest.

Ghana remains a warm tropical climate year-round. Temperatures are on average 85° F / 30° C both day and night exempt in the northern part where you may have temperature averaging 33 C in the day and 25 C in the night.

- In the Southern region and the Central area, there are two separate rainy seasons; April through June then, September through November.
- It is hotter and drier in the Northern Savanna region.

Upon arrival in Accra, Delegates will be met by Ushers from KNUST.


It is recommended that Delegates who arrive later than 17:00hrs GMT spend the night in Accra before proceeding to Kumasi on the next day.

Accra to Kumasi by Air

- Delegates travelling from Accra to Kumasi by flight:
 - KNUST to transport delegates from the hotel to the domestic terminal

Fufu and soup is highly favoured in Ghana's Eastern and Ashanti regions, cherished by the Akans.



Kenkey-Accra Kenkey

Similar to Banku, Kenkey and fried fish can be found on nearly every street in Ghana, particularly in the evenings.

Ghana has a wide range of cultural traditions, and this diversity is reflected in the language.

With English as its official language, the nation is home to more than 80 other tongues. Twi, Fante, Ewe, and Ga are the most commonly used languages.

While most Ghanaians have English names, they also have local names based on the day they were born and their gender. For example, individuals in Ghana are often given specific names corresponding to their gender and day of birth as indicated in the table.
